

Exciting developments are underway in the area of Literacy as staff begin exploring the MACS Vision for Instruction and what it means for the teaching and learning of reading within our unique context.



Starting next week, the students in the F-2 learning space will engage in targeted focus groups designed to meet their individual needs. In alignment with the latest evidence-based approaches to reading, our F-2 students will participate in explicit, structured lessons focusing on phonemic awareness, phonics, spelling, fluency and handwriting—building strong foundational skills that support their literacy development. Through these research-backed methods, we are committed to ensuring every child develops the skills and confidence they need to become successful readers.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) Application

Application forms for CSEF have sent to parents via your child please complete these and return to the school office for processing. If you are a holder of a Health Care Card and have not received an application form these are available at the school office.

Parent CSEF applications close on 4th July 2025.

To be eligible you must:

- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be the holder of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
 - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and
 - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
